Faithful Living in Difficult Times

Dear Friends,

"Faithful Living in Difficult Times" is the theme of this Fall's stewardship campaign. The kickoff date is 10/10/10. I know that sounds like a fertilizer, but it is a date that has a nice ring to it and one we can remember. Commitment Sunday will be held on November 7.

Over the course of four weeks, our Sunday morning scriptures will center around Biblical characters who remained faithful despite difficult times. It so happens that all of these Biblical characters are widows. Naomi and Ruth, the widows of Nain and Zarephath, and the widow who gave her "mite." I am thinking that these women appear in the Bible because they hold a special place in the heart of God. Can they be models for us in difficult times? Absolutely!

I have learned that stewardship growth does not happen by not talking about it. We grow as stewards of what we give and of what we keep by intentional planning and commitment. It would be my hope that over the course of time everyone would subscribe to the formula 10/10/80. This means that we give 10%, save 10% and live on 80%. You may or may not be surprised to know that most people are not anywhere close to these percentages.

For many people, these are difficult times. But the Good News is that God is able to see us through. The key is to remain faithful in these times, as well as, the good times. I do not know the future of our economy, but I do have a glimpse of the future. It is one where God will never leave us and will never forsake us. That is the Best News of All!

The September Council meeting helped kick off the busy fall season at The Brandermill Church.

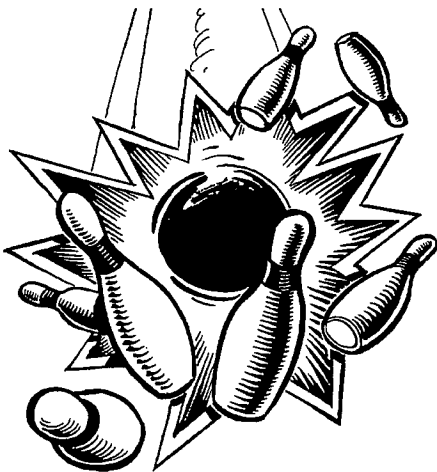
The "Upcoming Events" section of the meeting reinforced the level of activity and energy as all committees are in full swing. After our opening devotional and prayer, the council:

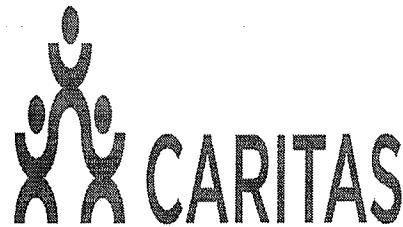

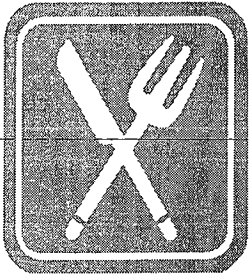


It is with great excitement that I am announcing a 2nd week of CARITAS! This is a first in so many ways. The Brandermill Church has always hosted a week in March with single men. This fall we will host another week, with families as our guests. I look forward to this ministry for so many reasons, we are such a caring and giving Church, I know that all of you will come through to volunteer, as you always do. The committee has thought and prayed about this endeavor for the past year, and we made the decision to move forward.

We will have three Sundays in October to begin sign ups for volunteering. We will need food items, lunches, shift workers, laundry and infant items to use during the week. The family focus is typically smaller, we'll have 28 individuals, which will make up several family units. We will hold two activity nights for the children and will also need youth to help with tutoring. The children will do homework after dinner, the atmosphere will be quiet and family time is encouraged. The kitchen may not be fully completed, so we may need to be very creative and adaptable to provide breakfast and lunch for our guests.

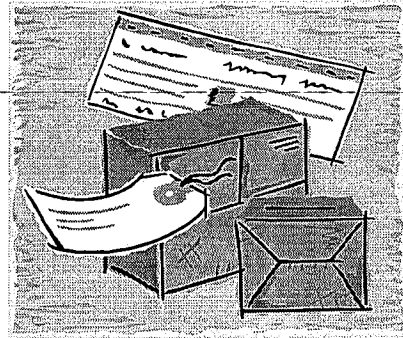
Wednesday Night Dinner

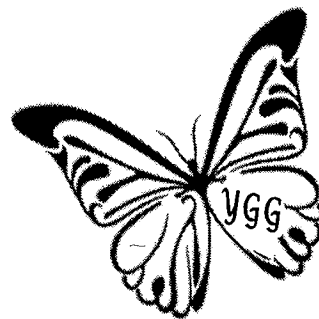

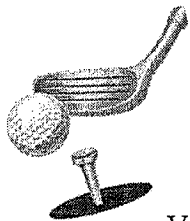

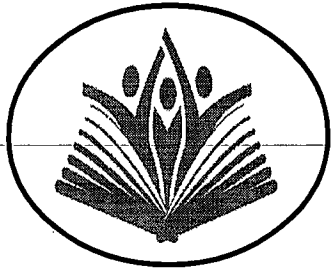

GOLF TOURNAMENT October 25 Brandermill Country Club

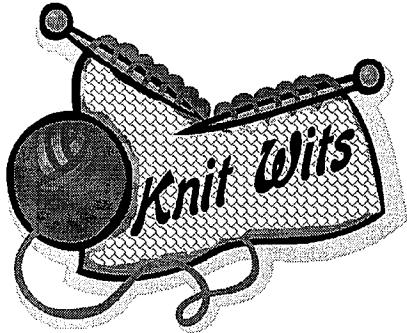

DISASTER IN GUATEMALA - SOLIDARITY IN TIMES OF TROUBLE

From July 31 through August 8 of this year The Brandermill Church supported a Mission Team of ten people in the mountains of Guatemala working with the Highlands Support Project (HSP) to build stoves for sixteen families to relieve serious respiratory problems inherent with the previous, open fire cooking and heating in their homes. Unfortunately, a tragedy has since touched the lives of several of those families. Excerpts from the HSP news release follows:

“On Saturday September 4, tragedy struck Pan American Hwy at kilometer 171, located just two kilometers from the municipality of Santa Catarina Ixtahuacán, Sololá. At about 1:00pm, from a height of one kilometer, a landslide swept down the mountain. Waiting below were 15 cars full of unsuspecting passengers. Approximately two hundred people were buried, and when found; most were in a great deal of pain but only a few serious injuries. Most suffered only broken bones, wounds and muscle pain. A radio station made an announcement concerning those caught in the wake of the landslide. Soon afterwards, altruistic inhabitants from nearby villages sought to liberate the engulfed. After toiling for many hours and having nearly completed clearing the road, another landslide enveloped them all. Without doubt, the most sobering aspect is the loss of 25 valiant lives. Willingly placing their lives in danger, they participated in the ultimate act of solidarity.”

“There were two men from the community of Pacutama who died, Domingo Tzaput Guarchaj and Miguel Vicente Guachiac Chivalán. Domingo was married to Dona Manuela Guachiac Guachiac. They have two sons and one daughter, all of who are very young. Doña Manuela is participating in a Women’s Circle and is being trained as a health promoter. Domingo was an important leader within the Catholic Church due to his role as “Extraordinary Minister of Communion.” Miguel Chivalán was 17 years old. His mother is unfortunately deceased, leaving his father, Don Juan Guachiac y Guachiac, with six children.”

Two of our members actually worked with Domingo to provide a stove for his family. The bond formed between all of the families in these effected villages and The Brandermill Church is very strong, and they continue to need our prayers.

Most of these families support themselves by growing beans, corn and other crops. We have reports that after the torrential rains that some areas have no viable crops.

“From Thursday to Tuesday we have been unable to work. Beans and corn are our main source of income, but now all the beans and most of the corn has been destroyed. The survivors who are in good health have come to request medical assistance for the injured, as many cannot afford to visit a hospital or purchase the proper medicines for pains, infections, etc.”

The Highland Support Project has established a restricted fund for the widows of men who risked their lives to save strangers. The Brandermill Church has sent a donation using funds designated for Guatemala Outreach. To add your personal support to the restricted fund for families you can mail a donation to:
